The courses in finance constitute a broad program of study designed to provide descriptive, behavioral, and analytical background of financial management to enable students to qualify for opportunities in banking, insurance, brokerage, government, real estate, and financial management of business enterprises. Finance is also an excellent area for those who wish to become more knowledgeable as consumers, particularly in the fields of investments, insurance, and real estate.

Areas of study in the field of finance include financial management, investments, insurance, real estate, banking, and security analysis. Upper level courses include a review of contemporary literature in the field, case studies, and financial problem analysis integrating finance courses previously taken.
